From the Manager's Desk

Summer's upon us

Hopefully those of you not in residence are enjoying your summer some place cooler visiting friends and family. The daytime temperature in Naples has been in the 90's with a normal summer afternoon rain pattern developing. Gulf water temperatures are in the upper 80's. The good news for those of us that remain here is traffic is almost nonexistent and we can dine at any restaurant in town with little or no wait.

The construction on the hallways is expected to start on Monday, July 11th. The contractor has submitted his plans to the county and is picking up the permits this week. In the meantime he has two storage containers with tools and materials that have been delivered to the site. You will be contacted in the next few days with the details and final cost of replacing the entry door to your unit. I will also notify you in advance of when work is being done on your floor. You will not have access to the elevators on your floor during the time that the contractor is installing the new tile in the elevator lobbies. The removal and installation will take about one week per floor. It will be necessary to use the stairs to go to either the floor above or the floor below to access an elevator. Once construction starts you can expect weekly updates on Friday afternoons.

The maintenance staff remains busy with summer projects. They are cleaning out the storage rooms, pressure washing and staining the boardwalk, pressure washing the pavers outside the front entrance. We also expect to be cleaning the garage and repainting and numbering the curb stops.

As always we continue to monitor weather patterns and alerts throughout the hurricane season. The staff has checked all equipment and supplies. Should a threat of a storm become imminent I will remain on the property. If we should experience any weather related issues you will be contacted as quickly as possible regarding your unit. Keep in mind that after a severe storm some lines of communication may be affected.

Phone Entry



Dr. Chung Tiak & Nam Sook Chung Unit 1902

Dr. Chung Taik Chung was born in Tae-Gu, Korea. He married Nam Sook Piak, a graduate of the College of Nursing of Yonsei University, and they have 3 children and 7 grandchildren. Dr. Chung received his undergraduate and medical education at the Yonsei University in Seoul, Korea, earing the M.D. degree in 1967. Following military service as flight surgeon in Korea, he immigrated to the United States in 1970. His internship was served at the Harrison S. Martland Hospital of the New Jersey College of Medicine and Dentistry, Newark, from 1970-71.

Dr. Chung's long association with Upstate Medical University and the Central New York community began in 1971 as a resident in Radiation Oncology. After completing his residency training in 1974, Dr. Chung served as Instructor for 1 year before moving to Wilkes-Barre, PA and private practice. He returned to Syracuse and Upstate in 1976 as Assistant Professor of Radiation Oncology in the Department of Radiology. He was promoted to Associate Professor in 1981, accepted a joint appointment in the Department of Otolaryngology and Communication Sciences in 1982, and was names Professor of both departments in 1991.

He has served on national cooperative protocol committees, such as the Cancer and Leukemia Group B (GALGB), and is an active member of numerous national medical societies, holding appointments to several committees such as: Currently he is chair for scientific program for Radiation oncology, Radiological Society of North America, one of the largest Scientific Medical Society of the world. Dr. Chung also currently serves or has previously held appointments in many local professional organizations.

Clinical research has played a significant role throughout Dr. Chung's career. His interest in the treatment of head and neck cancers began some 30 years ago and continues to date. In the 1980's and 90's, additional research interest included Hodgkin's disease, tumors of the eye and brain tumors. Beginning in the late 1990's he began to focus on Gamma Knife radiosurgery for brain sessions, and he has now begun researching the treatment of skull based tumors.

Long Range Planning Committee

Dear Owners,

The Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC); Bill Abney, Pat Costa, Kent Carson, Marcia Hawken, Bob Plager and Patti Trapnell want to thank the owners for participating in the Resident Corridor proxy vote. There were 76 ballots cast, almost 100% of the residents, 62 voted in favor of the project. The number of owners voting is an indication of how involved the owners are in the association.

At the May Board of Directors meeting the Directors approved the Master Plan design plan developed by Wegman Design Group of Naples. The plan includes several phases beyond the current Resident Corridor renovation. In order to address the state mandated upgrades to the spa and to replace the sauna the Board has asked for detailed design and cost estimates for the pool and decking phase of the Master Plan. Provided the construction estimates and timeline are in line and reasonable with the conceptual drawing from Wegman the Board will ask the owners later this summer to approve the renovation of the pool and decking as the next phase in the Master Plan. Expect to see in July more details including architectural drawings, material samples and pricing.

In order to get owner input during the planning process we are asking owners to participate in focus groups and joining the LRPC. If you have a desire to join in during the focus group sessions please let John know. Once the pool/deck designs, samples and pricing are available focus groups will be scheduled to get owners input.

Again, thanks to all who participated in the Corridor project and we look forward to getting owner input as the next phases of the Master Plan are addressed.
